<u>25-0312</u> Finance Director Linda Senne: Approve Changes to FY2026 Budget Since Budget Workshop (10 min.)

Finance Director Senne presented changes for FY 2026 since the budget workshop including June 1st property values, increase in revenue, increased EMS transport fees, added Firefighter positions, reduced Seaboard Master Plan funding, reduced Fire contribution to pension plan, added debt service payment for Fire Station 52, moved the Fleet Maintenance Facility expense, addition of Tarpon Center repaving, addition of awning for Marine Patrol, reduced budget for Fleet Facility.

Discussion took place regarding the review by Council, adjusting the roll back rate at the budget hearing, current stability in the budget, end of year projections, increased revenue, reserves, concerns for decreasing millage rate in case of emergency, Tarpon Center repaving adjustment, coordination with utilities projects, disaster reserves, individual impact of reducing rollback rate, importance of maintaining high bond ratings, personnel cost, balancing cost and level of service, providing options for September 9th hearing, pending union negotiations, reduction in reserves, potential fluctuations in housing values, and concerns for FY27 and later budgets.

MEDIATED SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

Consider Mediated Settlement Agreement and Recommendation of the Special Magistrate in Response to a Request for Relief Filed by Border Road Investments, LLC and Vistera Associates, LLC Relating to Zoning Map Amendment Petition No. 23-63RZ for the GCCF Planned Unit Development (PUD) Located South of Laurel Road East, North of Border Road and East of I-75

City Attorney Fernandez provided an introduction and history of the petition.

Attorney Mark Bentley, serving in the role of mediator, via Zoom, answered Council questions regarding the process.

Senior Planner Nicole Tremblay, reviewed the terms of the agreement, Density and Unit Limits, Operational Interconnection, Land Uses, Height, Lot Detail Standards, Signage Standards, Height Exception Application Progress, and answered Council questions regarding density.

City Attorney Fernandez commented on density uses in the Planned Unit

Development (PUD).

Senior Planner Tremblay reviewed PUDs in the area and answered Council questions regarding the PUD, number of units and density, the date of the original application, and open space.

Pat Neal, Applicant, spoke on the history of Neal Communities, their relationship with the City, and showed a map of Vistera.

Attorney Jeffery Boone, Agent for Applicant, spoke to density, the Florida Land Use and Environmental Dispute Resolution Act (FLUEDRA) process, the order of denial, compatibility, and density.

Jim Collins, Agent for Applicant, presented the definition of compatibility, and reviewed surrounding densities.

Attorney Boone, further addressed Compatibility Decision Criteria, Common Review procedures, Application Requirements, Planned District Zoning Amendments application requirements, unified control, the three reasons for denial, court proceedings, density, PUDs, and answered Council questions regarding density, concessions, the proposed agreement, stipulations, and possible height exceptions.

Mr. Neal answered a Council question regarding changing market dynamics, and the impact of the hospital.

Mr. Collins showed map and answered Council question regarding building height in the area,

Attorney Boone responded to Council questions regarding the agreement, density, height, number of reduction in density.

Recess was taken from 3:13 p.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Olen Thomas, 248 Acerno Drive, spoke against the mediated settlement agreement, and commented on compromise, and unified control.

Joan Iacono, 1132 Bird Bay Way, spoke on behalf of Venice Thrives, against the mediated settlement agreement and stated there is a lack of plan for the future of Venice.

Steve Carr, 149 Avens Drive, spoke on behalf of the Central Venice Coalition, concern about height exceptions, and wording in the document.

Attorney Boone responded to questions from Council regarding

12/09/2021 was the date of the Vistera map.

Mr. Collins responded to an earlier question regarding density in GCCF PUD, and stated it was originally approved for 1,799 dwelling units.

Attorney Boone responded to public concerns, current PUD allows request of up to 55 feet in height, protecting existing SF development to the south and to the east.

John Neal, Applicant, stated Council has approved ALF units, needs of the city and residents.

A motion was made by Mr. Engelke, seconded by Vice Mayor Boldt, to approve the Mediated Settlement Agreement.
