- Past year's achievements: The HAPB was established in October of 2022 and has been working under the approved rules and procedures adopted on November 10, 2022. The City achieved Certified Local Government (CLG) status on June 16, 2023. During the past year 1 new property has been added to the local register of historic resources due to our community awareness publications and educational seminars. The board has reviewed and made determinations on 14 Certificates of Architectural Compliance (CAC). Updated the City's website on the process and benefits of the local register.
- 2. Proposed agenda of priorities for the coming year:
- Continue to review applications for Certificates of Architectural Compliance (CAC) for properties in the architectural control districts and other applicable applications.
- Continue a historic preservation education outreach program and develop a historic preservation brochure. Maintain the Legacy Awards program.
- Continue community education seminars for historic architectural styles and historic preservation within the City of Venice and encourage Local Register applications for those who are eligible. Analyze and make recommendations based on the consultant provided survey of historic resources.
- Continue to update the approved color palette for the architectural control districts and reformat for easier use by Venice residents and businesses.
- 3. A) What goal in the City's strategic plan does your proposed agenda for the coming year support and B) describe how your proposed agenda will support that goal:
 - A) Goal Six: Preserve the Venice Quality of Life through Planning

Policy 3 of this goal says, "Preserve Venice's historical resources and significant structures." Through the adoption of the new LDRs and the formation of the new board, this is being accomplished. Much thought was put into the process of the development of the new LDRs, and they are being monitored for their effectiveness.

- 4. Areas of concern: Some board members have indicated a desire to review properties that are non-Nolen and are on the local register of historic resources. Discussion with Planning Commission is pending.
- 5. Activities/Tasks/Goals: Since this is a relatively new board operating under new LDRs, continue to seek opportunity to improve the operation of the board and the applicable LDRs.
