Mayor Pachota opened the public hearing.

Clerk Michaels read the ordinance by title only.

Written communications were provided in advance.

Planner Brittany Smith provided a presentation to include general information, project description, aerial map, existing and proposed conditions, future and proposed future land uses, current and proposed zoning maps, site photo, surrounding land uses, planning analysis, Comprehensive Plan consistency, Land Development Code compliance, Concurrency/Mobility, conclusions/findings of fact, and answered Council questions regarding density.

Joshua Law, Agent for the Applicant presented general information, location map, project site, photos, aerial photos, conceptual plan, the Comprehensive Plan, current future land use, proposed future land use, compatibility, surrounding units, surrounding condo/townhome density, buggering, proposed enhanced buffering, surrounding area buffering, conceptual plan, transportation, stormwater management, conclusion, requested approval, and answered Council questions regarding density, and intensity.

Steve Carr, 149 Avens Drive, expressed concerns on the zoning designation, density, and infill development.

Nancy DeForge, 332 Laurel Hollow Drive, expressed concerns on density and encouraged Council to deny the amendment.

Mayor Pachota closed the public hearing.

A motion was made by Mayor Pachota, seconded by Mr. Howard, to deny Ordinance No. 2025-16.

Discussion took place regarding compatibility and density, maintaining low density, surrounding neighborhood properties, attainable housing, intensity, and the benefits of build-to-own townhomes.

City Attorney Fernandez stated the ordinance is an update to Elections in the City Code and is consistent with Council's discussion at a previous meeting.

B. PRESENTATION WITH ACTION

<u>25-0221</u> Finance Director Linda Senne: Budget 3% Cap

Finance Director Senne stated they are requesting Council's permission to exceed the 3% budget cap in order to provide a balanced budget to Council on June 5th, which will exceed 3% from the prior year's original adopted budget as required by the Code. She stated the reasons for the increase are estimated pay increases, and related costs, increase in property and liability insurance, increase in vehicle rent payments, payment to Sarasota County based on the interlocal agreement, two police department full time equivalents (FTEs), Parks Master Plan, and the Seaboard Master Plan. She answered a Council question regarding the originally adopted budget amount basis versus using the amended budget amount as the basis. Code language is specific to original adopted budget amount when calculating the 3% cap.

City Manager Lavallee commented on the history of the 3% cap and measuring growth.

A motion was made by Vice Mayor Boldt, seconded by Mr. Engelke, to approve the request to exceed the 3% budget cap for the FY26 Budget.

Discussion took place regarding roll back rate, revenue, property taxes, taxing trends, reducing expenses, unwillingness to reduce staff increases, lowered millage in 2023, reserves, comparing cities, cost of services, cost of living, reviewing the budget line by line, and upcoming budget workshops.
