C. COUNCIL ACTION/DISCUSSION

20-4474 Response and Actions Related to COVID-19

Mr. Lavallee reported on Deputy Fire Chief Frank Giddens' communication with Sarasota County's Emergency Operations Center (EOC) and COVID-19 reports sent to staff on a daily basis, and responded to council questions regarding the city's budget projections.

Mr. Lavallee spoke on the city's initiative allowing food trucks licensed by the state to operate their businesses remotely, and responded to questions regarding protections surrounding food trucks and council obtaining hard data from the finance department on budget projections.

Ms. Stelzer noted finance staff will be presenting requested information at the next council meeting.

Discussion followed regarding the city's finances, developing contingencies based on revenue streams, and the the city's response to COVID-19.

Mayor Feinsod urged residents to wear a mask in public.

Chief Carvey reported on the department's SUV responding to calls along with the fire engine to minimize personnel exposure, Emergency Medical

Services (EMS) transition to include hiring paramedics, and daily meeting with EOC.

Mayor Feinsod noted city staff has done an excellent job keeping the community informed and encouraged residents to visit the city's website for information.

Approve Entering into a Local Funding Agreement with Sarasota County for the Use of Impact Fee Funds for the Administration of a Conceptual Design Process for Improvements to Laurel Road, with Stated Conditions by Sarasota County

Mr. Lavallee explained the county approved the use of up to \$400,000 in city impact fees to pay for the preliminary engineering of the project with contingencies to include the city would be responsible for managing the project, and the city would have up to ten years to complete the construction or pay back the cost of the initial engineering work, and inquired if council wants the city to proceed with formulating a funding agreement with the county.

Discussion took place regarding project management, engineering design timeframe, project funding, and process to solicit engineering firm.

Recess was taken at 10:31 a.m. until 10:37 a.m.

Pat Neal, Neal Communities, commented on success with previous projects, saving the city money, Stantec working on adjacent Neal Community project, benefits of private enterprise concepts, and requested to make a presentation on benefits of a public/private partnership at the next meeting in council chambers, the city proceed with discussions on a funding agreement with the county, and to defer selection of an engineering contract until his presentation is made to council.

A motion was made by Dr. Fiedler, seconded by Dr. Neunder, that the city proceed with a funding agreement with Sarasota County, and have staff and Pat Neal present a report to council at the next meeting held in council chambers.

Discussion took place regarding Laurel Road, project cost estimate and the city's contribution, funding sources to include state grants and impact fees, one-cent sales tax, and addressing the city's financial expectations.

Ms. Fernandez clarified a funding agreement will need to come before council for approval.

Discussion continued regarding project cost estimate and the city's contribution, paying back the county if the road is not constructed, project funding, unassigned mobility fees, grants, ten year pay back period, annual impact fee revenue from new construction, state funding, Pinebrook Road

and East Venice Avenue intersection project, designating impact fees for Laurel Road improvements, and mobility fees from new construction.

Recess was taken at 11:10 a.m. until 11:23 a.m. due to technical difficulties.

Mr. Lavallee reviewed impact fee estimates provided by the finance department.

Discussion followed on impact fee revenue from development, criteria for use of road and mobility impact fees, project funding sources, one-cent sales tax, Jacaranda Boulevard extension, April 28, 2020 virtual council meeting, the economy's financial recovery time, prioritizing critical needs for the city, and concern with the city entering a public/private partnership with Neal Communities.

Vice Mayor Newsom spoke to resident feedback received and noted residents are not in favor of spending discretionary money on road project at this time.

Discussion continued on postponing motion to a future meeting in council chambers.

A motion was made by Council Member Cautero, seconded by Council Member Moore, to postpone motion for Item No. 20-4475 to the first meeting in council chambers. The motion carried unanimously by voice vote.

Ms. Fernandez commented on today's virtual meeting process and possibility of structuring a meeting where all council members are present together.

Mr. Lavallee commented on accommodating council members with communication challenges.

Mr. Cautero had no report.

Council Member Neunder

Dr. Neunder noted distributing gloves to local businesses.

Mr. Pachota was absent.

Mayor Feinsod thanked Mr. Pachota for his service as a first responder.

Council Member Newsom

Mr. Newsom advised he will be present at city hall for the next council meeting, commented on planning commission member Tom Murphy, and reported on Council of Governments (COG) meeting.

Council Member Fiedler

Dr. Fiedler complimented staff for the wonderful job done during the pandemic.

Council Member Moore

Ms. Moore suggested including the city's Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) link when replying to the public and praised city staff for their work.

Mayor Feinsod

Mayor Feinsod commented on city staff, residents viewing FAQs on the city's website, and residents taking precautionary measures by wearing masks in public.
