Tomich, into the Corporate Limits of the City of Venice, Florida, and Redefining the Boundary Lines of the City to Include Said Additions; Providing for Repeal of all Ordinances in Conflict Herewith; Providing for Severability; and Providing for an Effective Date

Ms. Stelzer read the ordinance by title only.

Mayor Feinsod opened the public hearing.

No written communication was received.

Council waived staff's and applicant's presentation.

Tom Perigo, Director of Architecture and Construction for Sarasota Memorial Hospital (SMH), spoke regarding the July 22, 2020 utility cost sharing agreement, utility easement and corridor location, allowing hospital to participate in the review of the project's construction plans, and requested comments also apply to Comprehensive Plan Amendment Ordinance No. 2021-13.

Jeffery Boone, Boone Law Firm, noted client's interest in cooperating with involved parties, application was filed October 2020 and this is the first time hearing from SMH about issue, he is not aware of any potential problems, and requested council approve the annexation.

Ms. Fernandez responded to council questions regarding future conflicts with utility connections.

A motion was made by Dr. Fiedler that Ordinance No. 2021-12 be approved on first reading and scheduled for final reading.

Mr. Boone responded to council questions regarding open burning and communicating with SMH on utility easement.

An Ordinance of the City of Venice, Florida, Amending the 2017-2027 City of Venice Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use Map Pursuant to Petition No. 20-53CP to Change the Future Land Use Designation of Specific Real Property Generally Located South of Laurel Road E, East of Pinebrook Road, and North Of Curry Lane, Commonly Known as 0 Curry Lane (5± Acres), from Sarasota County Moderate Density Residential to City of Venice Institutional Professional; Providing for Repeal of all Ordinances in Conflict Herewith; Providing for Severability; and Providing an Effective Date

Ms. Stelzer read the ordinance by title only.

Mayor Feinsod opened the public hearing.

Ms. Tremblay provided a presentation to include project information, aerial, future land use and existing zoning maps, surrounding land uses, comprehensive plan request, proposed neighborhood revisions, comprehensive plan consistency, joint planning area (JPA) six, compatibility, land development code (LDC) consistency, conclusions/findings of fact, and planning commission's report and recommendation.

Mr. Vargas responded to council questions regarding the city's utility connections with the hospital to include location.

Mr. Boone questioned Mr. Vargas regarding his meeting with staff on sewer connections, negotiating an agreement with the city on extending sewer services in the area, utility connection traversing Florida Power and Light (FPL)'s easement, connection location, and utility cost sharing agreement.

Mr. Boone requested council approve the comprehensive plan amendment application.

Mr. Perigo read a section of the utility cost sharing agreement regarding corridor selection, and reclues ted an opportunity to review constituction plans.

Mr. Boone questioned Mr. Perigo on SMH's role in obtaining consent for the FPL easement.

Ms. Fernandez and Mayor Feinsod advised Mr. Boone's questioning was inappropriate.

Ms. Fernandez responded to council questions regarding council's involvement in this matter and parties resolving issue during the site and development plan stage.
