

CHARACTERISTICS OF MODERN ARCHITECTURE:

- <u>exposed structural members</u> not hidden behind another material

- materials kept in their natural state left "plain and simple"
- a lack of applied decoration / ornament "the materials are the decoration"
 - "flat" roofs
 that is, they look like they are flat







