If the attached aerial photocopy can be added to the Sept. 13th city council agenda item for UMBC - Venice historical register approval that would be helpful.

This photo puts into context the 30 or more family homes in Venice's only historical black community prior to 1970, homes built possibly around the 1940's, the church built in 1955. Land was donated by A.E. Blackburn. The small church is the only remaining building and still stands today, and the congregation is alive and well!

I purchased the digital photo #1095 from the Historical Resources of Venice in March 2021 and presented it to the Union Missionary Baptist Church pastor, Rev. James J. Mitchell as a gift, framed, with proper credit to the city.
