**RE:** FY22 Goals and Concerns from the Historic Preservation Board and Architectural Review Board

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In preparation of the Historic and Architectural Preservation Board creating proposed FY23 goals to present to City Council, staff has compiled the approved items from the FY22 presentations to City Council along with presented concerns that these boards had.

#### Architectural Review Board Approved Agenda of Priorities

- Continue to review petitions for Certificates of Compliance
- Develop criteria for evaluation of historic structures proposed for demolition

#### Architectural Review Board Approved Goals

- Continue to complete high-level reviews and evaluations of architectural structures within the control districts which focus on preservation of the City's rich historic fabric.

#### Architectural Review Board Areas of Concern

- ARB Board Members are serving at a high capacity and it would be extremely difficult to provide added responsibilities to establish additional architectural control districts or establish regulations for additional architectural styles as proposed in the draft of the new LDR.

#### Historic Preservation Board Approved Goals

- Develop an annual plan with timelines
- Develop a historic preservation education/outreach program
- Develop a historic preservation brochure
- Develop a City of Venice historic marketing plan

#### Historic Preservation Board Areas of Concern

- The Board would like to clarify our goals and duties with City Council, but need improved communications with other advisory boards that affect historic preservation. One example is, the Planning Commission should have held a joint session with our board before recommending radical changes to it in the new proposed LDRs. In addition, the Council's elimination of subcommittees make discreet tasks and projects more difficult to implement, as all work must flow through the full-sized board during our regular sessions.
