Lenox Bramble began his 14-year career with the City of Venice on May 14, 2007, as Utilities Director and was promoted to Assistant City Manager on Nov. 17, 2014.

Len's prior public service included Public Works Director and County Engineer for York County, South Carolina, Public Works Director for Manatee County, (both included Utilities) and as a supervisor over the wastewater permitting group with the State of Washington Department of Ecology.
