B. PRESENTATIONS

<u>21-4877</u> Dave Hutchinson, Executive Director, Sarasota/Manatee Metropolitan Planning Organization (10 min.)

Dave Hutchinson, Executive Director, Sarasota/Manatee Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), provided a presentation and spoke on origins of MPOs, Sarasota/Manatee MPO Board, MPO planning area and structure, project priorities process, 2045 long range transportation plan (LRTP) to include cost feasible project list, and responded to council questions regarding local impact fee revenue generated, working with staff on projects, state funding and grants impacted by COVID-19, bus routes, roundabouts, gas tax revenue funding road expansion, and safety for pedestrians and bicyclists at roundabouts.

Vice Mayor Cautero noted resident comments received on roundabouts.

Dr. Fiedler requested Mr. Hutchison's presentation be included in the agenda packet.

Mr. Hutchinson responded to council questions on projected rate of gas tax revenue loss, and commented on ownership of cars and curb spaces.

20-4647 Planning Manager Roger Clark, Building Official Greg Schneider, and Bruce Cowans, MGT Consulting Group: Review Development Services Fee Study and Request Approval for Staff to Draft a Fee Schedule Resolution (30 min.)

This Item was pulled from the agenda.

<u>21-4875</u> Direct Staff to Research what Other Cities are Doing to Protect Historic Structures (Feinsod)

In response to council, Ms. Fernandez explained council can provide direction to staff.

Discussion followed on staff researching actions taken by other jurisdictions in protecting historic structures, whether staff has begun process as part of the LDR updates, and HPB's engagement in a historic preservation ordinance.

Mr. Shrum confirmed the consultant was asked to research other jurisdictions.

Vice Mayor Cautero commented on the draft historic preservation ordinance and advisory board initiatives.

Mayor Feinsod called for a point of order noting advisory boards are a separate discussion, then withdrew his point of order.

Discussion ensued on council postponing action on this item and obtaining information through the LDR process.

<u>21-4876</u> Direct City Attorney to Research Potential Legal Remedies for Land Clearing/Open Burning (Cautero)

Vice Mayor Cautero spoke on purpose of his request.

Discussion followed regarding coordinating with the county for a countywide initiative.

Dr. Fiedler noted Ronald Doering, Friends of Pinebrook Park, spoke at the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board meeting on working with the Florida

Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) to chip the underbrush at Pinebrook Park.

Dr. Neunder advised of his communication with State Representative Vern Buchanan on the city's concern with open burning.

The city attorney agreed to work with staff to research potential additional strategies for addressing land clearing/open burning and report back to council.
