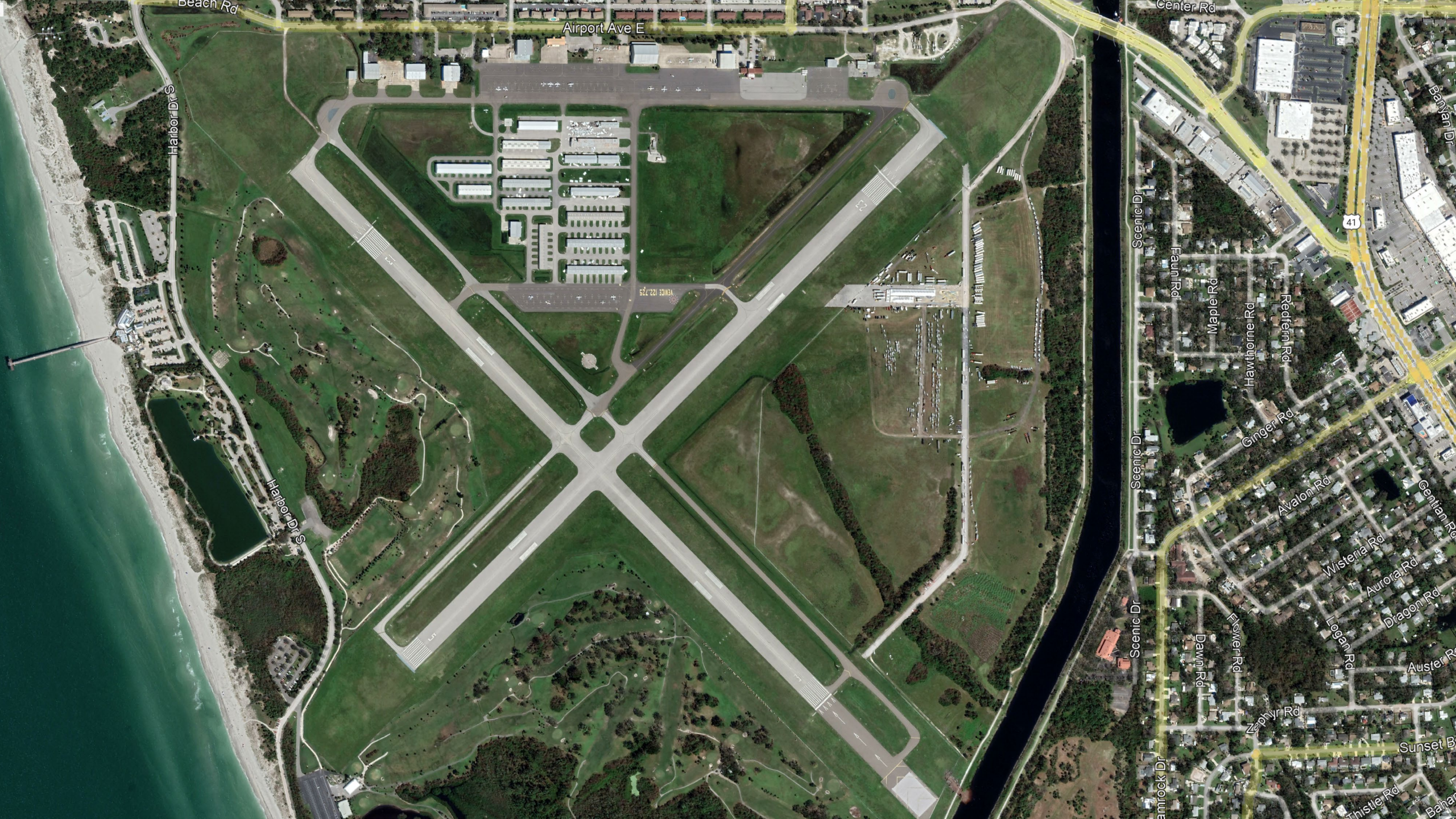

- Friday 9/30/22 Runways and Taxiways Clear
 - Airport opened for operations
- 10/4/22 Re-closed airport access through gates. Manually closed gates & restricted airport access due to unsafe activity and liability concerns
- Hangar area remains inaccessible as crews work to stage and remove debris

- Working to open as many askew doors as possible to provide access to tenants
- Loose steel panels, beams and columns were staged to be loaded into dumpsters.
- Aircraft moved out of damaged hangars to tie-down spots
- Aircraft deemed a total loss moved to Taxiway Charlie

- Demolition of water damaged walls in hangars
- Hangar doors rehung on tracks where possible
- Airport staff escorts tenants to and from their hangars to assess damage and retrieve belongings
- Airport staff escorts tenant's insurance adjusters to and from aircraft
- Access for tie-down and hangar tenants permitted, staggered access based on safety determined by each hangar

- As Engineering reports are reviewed we begin to open access to more hangars
- Aircraft are moved off of tie-downs and into hangars that have been deemed safe to occupy
- Totaled aircraft are moved off of Taxiway Charlie to available tie-downs and Charlie is opened for aircraft use
- Aircraft Wash rack is reopened
- 11/1/22 (one day shy of five weeks since landfall)
unrestricted tenant access was returned to all hangars other than 19 individual units deemed unsafe by engineer's reports, and shade hangar building

- 11/8/22 contacted tenants (19) who have no access to their leased hangars – giving option to cancel lease effective 10/1/22 or sign an addendum to put lease on hold until repaired or rebuilt
- 11/11/22 met with representatives of the Swift Group
- 11/30/22 contacted tenants who are leasing a hangar with partial doors or walls to sign an addendum effective 11/1/22 to reduce rent from \$275 to \$125/month
- 11/30/22 contacted all tenants explaining they will receive a credit for October rent as very few had access
