The City of Venice, in accordance with the procedures for Expedited State Review, Florida Statutes (FS) Chapter 163.3184(3), is transmitting an Amendment to the City of Venice 2017-2027 Comprehensive Plan. Petition No. 22-63CP specifically updates development data for each mixed use future land use designated area in each of the seven comprehensive plan neighborhoods of the City. The petition updates the numbers regarding both residential and non-residential development in each of the identified areas through November 1, 2022.

The proposed Comprehensive Plan Amendment, Petition No. 22-63CP, was heard by the City Council in a transmittal hearing on February 14, 2023, and on a vote of 6-1, City Council approved Ordinance 2023-04 on first reading and approved transmittal of the petition to the Department of Economic Opportunity for review. Pursuant to Florida Statutes (FS), Chapter 163.3184(3)(b), this memo serves to certify that the proposed Comprehensive Plan Amendment and related documentation is also being transmitted to required review agencies listed at the bottom of this letter.

#### Description of Proposed Comprehensive Plan Amendment:

The subject Comprehensive Plan Amendment specifically updates development data for each mixed use future land use designated area in each of the seven comprehensive plan neighborhoods of the City. The petition updates the numbers regarding both residential and non-residential development activity in each of the identified areas through November 1, 2022.

#### This Amendment is not related to:

- An area of critical state concern pursuant to FS Chapter 380.05,
- A rural land stewardship area pursuant to FS Chapter 163.3248,
- A sector plan pursuant to FS Chapter 163.3245,

Dear Mayor Pachota:

The Department of Economic Opportunity ("Department") has reviewed the proposed comprehensive plan amendment for the City of Venice (Amendment No. 23-01ESR) received on February 17, 2023. The review was completed under the expedited state review process. We have no comment on the proposed amendment.

The City should act by choosing to adopt, adopt with changes, or not adopt the proposed amendment. For your assistance, we have enclosed the procedures for adoption and transmittal of the comprehensive plan amendment. In addition, the City is reminded that:

- Section 163.3184(3)(b), F.S., authorizes other reviewing agencies to provide comments directly to the City. If the City receives reviewing agency comments and they are not resolved, these comments could form the basis for a challenge to the amendment after adoption.
- The second public hearing, which shall be a hearing on whether to adopt one or more comprehensive plan amendments, must be held within 180 days of your receipt of agency comments or the amendment shall be deemed withdrawn unless extended by agreement with notice to the Department and any affected party that provided comment on the amendment pursuant to Section 163.3184(3)(c)1., F.S.
- The adopted amendment must be rendered to the Department. Under Section 163.3184(3)(c)2. and 4., F.S., the amendment effective date is 31 days after the Department notifies the City that the amendment package is complete or, if challenged, until it is found to be in compliance by the Department or the Administration Commission.

The Office of Intergovernmental Programs of the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has reviewed the above-referenced amendment package under the provisions of Chapter 163, Florida Statutes. The Department conducted a detailed review that focused on potential adverse impacts to important state resources and facilities, specifically: air and water pollution; wetlands and other surface waters of the state; federal and state-owned lands and interest in lands, including state parks, greenways and trails, conservation easements; solid waste; and water and wastewater treatment.

Based on our review of the submitted amendment package, the Department has found no provision that, if adopted, would result in adverse impacts to important state resources subject to the Department's jurisdiction.
