SUBJECT: Cross-Connection Control Ordinance and Handbook Revision

Background:

Recent changes in Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) rules have prompted a change in the requirements for public water systems' cross-connection control programs. These changes reflect a desire by the State to reduce the burden of installation and testing of backflow prevention assemblies for residential water customers. Changes to our City Program include:

- Elimination of a high cost backflow preventer (the Reduced Pressure Principal /RP) for residential customers except in hazardous conditions to protect the drinking water.
- Elimination of most above ground installations for residential customers.
- Reduction of annual backflow testing for residential customers to once every two years for testable assemblies.
- Establishes approval for non-testable dual check valves for residential services.
- Replacement or refurbishment of residential dual check valves every 10 years.

Requested Action:

We request Council's consideration of the revised cross-connection control program that will lower the citizen burden of backflow prevention for residential customers and meet new DEP rules for the Utility.
