> Re: City of Venice Municipal Firefighters' Pension Trust Fund - Proposed Ordinance

Dear Mr. Lavallee:

As you know, I represent the Board of Trustees of the City of Venice Municipal Firefighters' Pension Trust Fund. Attached please find a proposed ordinance amending the City of Venice Municipal Firefighters' Pension Trust Fund which is recommended by the Board of Trustees for adoption by the City. This ordinance amends Section 50-83, Board of Trustees, to provide an option to allow a retired firefighter or other individual to serve in a firefighter seat on the Board of Trustees under certain circumstances. The ordinance provides that once the number of active firefighters falls below 10, the firefighter trustee seats may be held by either active or retired firefighters who are elected by the active and retired firefighters of the plan. If there are no active or retired firefighters remaining in the plan or capable of serving, the remaining board members may elect an individual to serve in the active firefighter seats. The authority for this provision is found in Section 175.061(1)(c), Florida Statutes. As of 10/1/22, our closed plan was down to 14 active firefighters and we have had several retirements in this fiscal year so we are approaching 10 actives in our plan. This proposal is necessary to assure that we can fill our two firefighter trustee seats. This proposed change is similar to the change we made to the Police Pension plan last year. The City will not incur any additional cost with the adoption of this ordinance.

By copy of this letter to the Board's actuary, Foster & Foster, Inc., I am requesting that they provide you with a letter confirming that there is no cost associated with the adoption of this ordinance.

If you or any member of your staff have any questions with regard to this ordinance, please feel free to give me a call. In addition, if you feel it would be appropriate for me to be present at the meeting at which this ordinance is considered by the City Council, please contact my office to advise me of the date that the ordinance would be considered.

## ORDINANCE NO. 2023-

## AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF VENICE, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 50, PERSONNEL, ARTICLE III, PENSIONS AND RETIREMENT, DIVISION 2, MUNICIPAL FIREFIGHTERS' PENSION TRUST FUND; AMENDING SECTION 50-83, BOARD OF TRUSTEES; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY OF PROVISIONS; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

**WHEREAS**, amendments to the pension plan are proposed to provide for a change in the composition of the Board of Trustees, as permitted by F.S., Ch. 175.;

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF VENICE, FLORIDA:

**SECTION 1**: Chapter 50, Personnel, Article III, Pensions and Retirement, Division 2, Municipal Firefighters' Pension Trust Fund, Section 50-83, Board of Trustees, subsection (a), *Composition; appointment and term of members; meetings; legal status,* is hereby amended to read as follows

\* \* \* \* \*

(a) Composition; appointment and term of members; meetings; legal status. The sole and exclusive administration of and responsibility for the proper operation of the retirement system and for making effective the provisions of this division are hereby vested in a board of trustees. The board is hereby designated as the plan administrator. The board shall consist of five trustees, two of whom, unless otherwise prohibited by law, shall be legal residents of the city, who shall be appointed by the city council, and two of whom shall be members of the system, who shall be elected by a majority of the firefighters who are members of the system. Once the active firefighter membership of this closed plan falls below 10, the active firefighter member seats may be held by either a retired firefighter or an active firefighter who is elected by the active and retired firefighters of the plan. If there are no active or retired firefighters remaining in the plan or capable of serving, the remaining board members may elect an individual to serve in an active firefighter seat. Upon receipt of such person's name, the City Council shall, as a ministerial duty, appoint such person to the board. The fifth trustee shall be chosen by a majority of the previous four trustees as provided for in this subsection, and such person's name shall be submitted to the city council. Upon receipt of the fifth person's name, the city council shall, as a ministerial duty, appoint such person to the board of trustees as its fifth trustee. The fifth trustee shall have the same rights as each of the other four trustees appointed or elected as provided in this subsection and shall serve a four-year term unless he sooner vacates the office. Each resident trustee shall serve as trustee for a period of four years, unless he sooner vacates the office or is sooner replaced by the city council, at whose pleasure the trustee shall serve. Each member trustee shall serve as trustee for a period of four years, unless he sooner leaves the employment of the city as a firefighter or otherwise vacates his office as trustee, whereupon a successor shall be chosen in the same manner as the departing trustee. Each trustee may succeed himself in office. The board shall establish and administer the nominating and election procedures for each election. The board shall meet at least quarterly each year. The board shall be a legal entity with, in addition to other powers and responsibilities contained in this division, the power to bring and defend lawsuits of every kind, nature and description.

**<u>SECTION 2</u>**: Specific authority is hereby granted to codify and incorporate this Ordinance in the existing Code of Ordinances of the City of Venice.

**<u>SECTION 3</u>**: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

**<u>SECTION 4</u>**: Severability. The provisions of this Ordinance are severable; and if any section, subsection, sentence, clause or provision is held invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

<u>SECTION 5</u>: Effective date. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
