


# Office of the Mayor



## Proclamation

**WHEREAS** in 1872, the Nebraska Board of Agriculture established a special day to be set aside for the planting of trees, and

**WHEREAS** this holiday, called Arbor Day, was first observed with the planting of more than a million trees in Nebraska, and

**WHEREAS** Arbor Day is now observed throughout the nation and the world, *and*

**WHEREAS** trees can be a solution to combating climate change by reducing the erosion of our precious topsoil by wind and water, cutting heating and cooling costs, moderating the temperature, cleaning the air, producing life-giving oxygen, and providing habitat for wildlife, *and*

**WHEREAS** trees are a renewable resource giving us paper, wood for our homes, fuel for our fires, and countless other wood products, *and*

**WHEREAS** trees in our city increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas, and beautify our community, *and*

**WHEREAS** trees — wherever they are planted — are a source of joy and spiritual renewal.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Nick Pachota, Mayor of the City of Venice, on behalf of the Venice City Council, do hereby proclaim January 16, 2026 as

### **FLORIDA ARBOR DAY**
