I am a City of Venice resident who opposes Pat Neal's multiple proposed developments in Venice. I was at the Neal Communities meeting of 3/20/14 regarding his Border Rd. purchase. Neighbors in the Border Rd. area have valid concerns about how his development will impact their properties due to flooding of the Myakka River and impact the existing wildlife that travel from the 2 county preserve areas nearby. My concerns are of a different nature.

I am opposed to any of my tax dollars as a resident of Venice to go toward his Pinebrook Rd., Border Rd. or Jacaranda proposed developments. I do not support city water or sewer being established on his properties when my own street is in terrible shape. My street (Groveland Ave.) was further negatively impacted when the county paved their portion of the street and ran their trucks all through the City's neighboring streets. Whenever we get a heavy rain and E. Venice Ave. floods, city workers are at the pump station near my home pumping water to make sure the sewer does not back up. Our pipes are old and in need of replacement, our streets buckled and in need of repair, yet my tax dollars are marked to provide decent water and sewer to brand new homes. This is not right.

Mr. Neal wants to change existing zoning from OUE to PUD on the Windwood and Woods developments. I do not support the zoning change from one house per five acres to two or five houses per acre. My concern is about the environmental impact that this would have in our community let alone the increase in traffic in along Pinebrook and Venice Aves. During this winter there have been times that I have not been able to get onto E. Venice Ave heading toward the Venice Ave. Bridge due to the traffic jams.

I would like to see our town and community remain the same place that people come to visit and live in due to the quality of life here. I do not want to see such rapid growth that our current way of life for ourselves and our wildlife becomes non-existent.

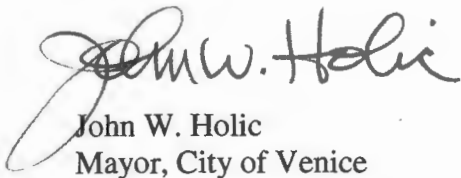

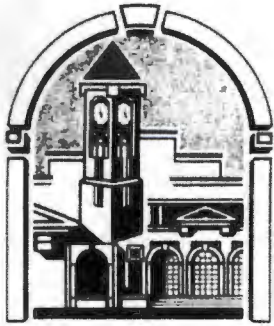
jams and accidents is also one of my concerns. The emergency vehicles have a hard time getting through. More houses, people means more traffic jams.
