SUBJECT / TOPIC: Authorizing the City of Venice, Florida to apply for, and accept when offered, Federal Grant monies from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) in association with the construction of the Airport Administration/Terminal Building in the amount of \$950,000.00.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: The existing Airport Terminal/Administration Building at Venice Municipal Airport is about forty years old and in need of replacement. Additionally, the facility has exceeded its life expectancy, requires constant maintenance, and does not meet ADA requirements. Thus, a new Terminal/Administration Building at Venice Municipal Airport must be constructed. The design will be for a new facility in close proximity to the existing Administration Building and will consist of approximately 5,000 square feet of common use area, conference rooms, pilot flight planning area and office space. The new building will be designed to be hardened to withstand a hurricane to facilitate the opening of the airport as soon as possible after a storm. A new parking facility and access roadway will also be designed for this facility. This new Terminal/Administration Building will replace the existing building.

The construction costs for this project are estimated at approximately \$6 million. FDOT has already committed to providing about \$4 million in grant funds. The FAA has indicated to the City that \$950,000 in funds could be available through BIL for the construction of this project if the City Council consents to this application and forwards the approval to the FAA by 17 July 2024.

Project Description:	This project includes the construction of the replacement terminal building.
Project Justification:	 The existing terminal building was constructed in 1989 and does not meet the current Florida Building Code or ADA Code. Additionally, the existing building is not energy efficient and all mechanical, plumbing, and electrical systems are outdated requiring continuous repair or replacement. The new terminal building will be relocated on a vacant site southwest of the existing terminal building. This location provides a direct view of the airfield and both runways, allowing for the continuous monitoring of airfield operations by airport personnel helping to identify any unsafe situation on the airfield. The proposed building description is provided below: 8,670 square-foot 2-story including office spaces, community room, pilot lounge, etc. Construction of new parking facilities associated with modifications to the existing access road, security fencing, airfield access gate, new stormwater infrastructure, installation of utilities (water, sewer, power, gas, and communications), and landscaping and irrigation. The entire building will be protected with an approved fire protection system.

Project Description

The existing terminal building was constructed in 1989 and does not meet the current Florida Building Code or ADA Code. Additionally, the existing building is not energy efficient and all mechanical, plumbing, and electrical systems are outdated requiring continuous repair or replacement. The new terminal building will be relocated on a vacant site southwest of the existing terminal building. This location provides a direct view of the airfield and both runways, allowing for the continuous monitoring of airfield operations by airport personnel helping to identify any unsafe situation on the airfield. The proposed building will be approximately 4,420 square feet with two stories. The project will include the construction of sidewalks from Airport Avenue to the Terminal, a new access roadway, parking, and landscaping. The new building will provide a conference room, pilot's lounge, and offices in addition to other public amenities such as a break room.

The new terminal building site is currently a green space with a few pine trees and picnic tables/benches. The new location is identified on the attached ALP.

Floodplains

The site for the new terminal building has areas identified by FEMA as Floodplain Zone X which is the area determined to be outside the 500-year flood. The project includes drainage modification to compensate for the additional pavement for the parking areas. (See attached FEMA FIRM Map)

Wetland Impacts

There are no wetlands within the new terminal location. (See attached Wetland Map)

Threatened and Endangered Species

There is no evidence of threatened or endangered species on the new terminal site.
