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Jim -

After the Planning Department solemnly assured the public during the recent struggle over the LDRs that a height exception in the downtown historic district "had never been granted in the 30 years the ordinance has existed", Council is being asked to grant an exception to permit a building over **TWICE** the height of buildings in the Venice Avenue District.

The Venice Theater is asking to build a **75 foot** fly loft to handle the scenery for the theater, citing safety concerns of the previous structure, and an effort to employ "industry best practices." Neither can justify the height exception.

According to the Theater's Technical Director, John Anzules, the safety issue of the previous fly loft was it had no load rail on which weights to provide a counterweight to the scenery could be attached safely. The new structure will have a load rail, apparently without any increase in height necessary.

As for industry best practices, the AACT (American Association of Community Theaters) the industry standard for fly lofts is more than twice (or 2 1/2 times - see theatrecrafts.com/pages/home/topics/rigging/counterweight-systems/) the "proscenium arch" - the height of the stage opening. The new plan for the stage is for an 18-foot arch, as opposed to the previous 16-foot arch. The industry standard thus would be for a 45-foot fly tower. This is consistent with the testimony of Mr. Anzules before the Planning Commission, who said the fly loft needed to be 40 feet high to hide scenery from the audience, plus 4 or 5 feet to hide the rail holding the scenery - yes, the same 45 feet the industry standard calls for. And slightly LESS than the 46.5 feet the Theater could rebuild under the grandfather provision. (I would urge you to review Mr. Anzules' testimony at Minute 50:00 at the video record of the Planning Commission.)

Whatever you decide the Theater "needs" for a fly loft, you need to take into account what a 75 foot monolith rising up in the middle of one, two and three-story buildings that adjoin would mean to the fabric of the historic downtown. The planned loft, 60 feet wide and 38 feet deep, is equivalent to a six-story condo with each floor consisting of 22-2400 sq ft. To suggest as does the applicant and staff the 75-foot tower is "consistent" with even taller condo towers hundreds of yards distant is pure

sophistry. The existing fly loft, at 46.5 feet, already dominates the downtown skyline for those approaching Venice over the KMI Bridge. A tower nearly 30 feet higher would exacerbate the situation. The historic building being altered here, first a garage, then a gymnasium and armory for KMI cadets, should not now be permitted to overwhelm even the San Marco Hotel of which it was once a part (now the KMI Building).

Rather than approve the exception, please put the burden where it belongs - on the applicant - to demonstrate **WHY it's NEEDED**. Require the applicant to return with more evidence.

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Dear Mayor Pachota and Council Members,

My remarks to you today regarding the hearing tomorrow for the height exception for the Venice Theatre are in no way meant to be interpreted as opposition to providing what the theatre needs for a new fly tower. My concern is why 70' high? Nothing has been presented as evidence that 70' is necessary.

The Community THeatre Association of America gives the guideline for a fly tower as 2.5 times the height of the proscenium arch. According to the testimony of John Anzules, VT Technical Director and Stage Production Manager, the proscenium arch of the VT was 16' and now will be 18', so they need 45'.

(View his testimony at the PC meeting on 6/6/23.) He goes on to talk about safety and that no load rail was available before. So, say add another 10' and the tower would be 56'. There is no testimony about why a 70' exception is needed.

The approval of a height exception is a serious matter, rarely given. And we need to be aware of the fact that this building is an Historic structure.

To add a 6 story box to this building is not acceptable. Some compromise needs to be made to blend more successfully this fly tower with the architecture of this important Historic building.

I say yes, approve what the teatre needs, but not a 70' tower which according to the facts presented by John Anzulas, the industry standard is 2.5 times the Proscenium arch.

- 4, According to the American Association of Community Theater, "the ideal fly loft should be more than twice the height of the arch."
