Proclamation

Whereas, domestic violence is a serious crime that affects people of all ages, income levels, and gender, but most often women and children; and

Whereas, once started, the campaign of physical, psychological, economic and sexual violence only gets worse, resulting in a heavy burden on society and families; and

Whereas, 108,046 domestic violence offenses were reported in the State of Florida in 2012, including 191 deaths at the hands of intimate partners and family members; and

Whereas, in Sarasota County, there were 1,445 crimes of domestic violence reported during 2012, including 7 homicides; and

Whereas, Safe Place and Rape Crisis Center (SPARCC) provides free services to victims of domestic and sexual violence and their children in Sarasota and DeSoto Counties, and seeks to stop the crime of domestic violence through public awareness and education.

Now, Therefore, I, John W. Holic, Mayor of the City of Venice on behalf of the Venice City Council do hereby proclaim the month of October 2013 as:

Domestic Violence Awareness Month

and urge all citizens to observe this month by becoming aware of the tragedy of domestic violence, supporting those who are working toward its end and participating in community efforts.
