Condition Report For# 051

Vehicle #051 is a 2007 Ford, Crown Victoria patrol cruiser assigned to the Police Department. Currently, the vehicle has 78,711 miles on it. The repair/maintenance cost from 8-1-2014 to 7-31-2016 were \$1,106.08. The transmission won't shift at all. Which it would require an expensive overhaul to schedule. Paint is missing in various places. Rust on the body work and it runs rough.

Patrol cruisers need to be replaced usually every 7 years and/or 100,000 miles depending on circumstances. These vehicles are subject to severe car chases, hard stops, and sharp turns, put through extreme under pressure situations.

Condition Report For# 066

Vehicle #066 is a 2008 Ford, Crown Victoria patrol cruiser assigned to the Police Department. Currently, the vehicle has 97,966 miles on it. The repair/maintenance cost from 8-1-2014 to 7-31-2016 were \$422.94. The tie rod needs to be replaced. The paint is also missing in various places and it runs very rough.

Patrol cruisers as a standard, are projected to be replaced at the 100,000 mile benchmark and this vehicle has almost met its criteria. Taking that into consideration; the expense to fix this vehicle will not outweigh to retain it.

Condition Report For# 068

Truck #068 is a 2005 Ford, F150 ½ Ton pickup truck assigned to the Police Department. Currently, the vehicle has 120,533 miles on it. The repair/maintenance cost from 8-1-2014 to 7-31-2016 were \$2,479.50.

This vehicle was used in Undercover/Detective work.

Condition Report For# 069

Truck #069 is a 1967 AM General, M35 2½ ton 6x6 off-road cargo Military truck assigned to the Police Department. Currently, the vehicle has 17,664 miles on it. The entire body is rusted, steering is very tough. The batteries need to be replaced, and will not start or run. This truck remains stationary because there is no operational use for this type of vehicle.

Condition Report For# 085

Vehicle #085 is a 2006 Ford, Crown Victoria patrol cruiser assigned to the Police Department. Currently, the vehicle has 115,250 miles on it. The repair/maintenance cost from 8-1-2014 to 7-31-2016 were \$1,106.15. Paint is missing in various places. There is no back seat and it runs rough.

Patrol cruisers need to be replaced either every 7 years and/or 100,000 miles depending on the circumstances. This vehicles was subject to car chases, hard stops, and sharp turns, put through extreme situations.

All of these vehicles/equipment should be declared surplus and disposed of. Some no longer run or will require expensive repairs.

They have met or exceeded the life expectancy as defined in the replacement schedule. (Age & Mileage).

They have all been replaced.
