STEPS TO GOLD



KEY STEPS TO GOLD



» Adopt the NACTO Urban Bikeway Design Guide. This will make it easier for city staff to propose and implement bicycle facility designs that have been shown to improve conditions for people who bike in other cities throughout the United States.

» Venice has many bicycling events such as Sharky's Ride the Beaches, Tour de Parks, Rev3 Triathlon, The Pasta Bash, and Piggy's Revenge. Ensure that there are events that provide an introduction to biking as well, including integrating bicycle education in existing public events that create street spaces closed to motor vehicles.

» Develop outreach methods that specifically target families, women, seniors, and low-income communities in addition to

general non-targeted outreach and media campaigns that discuss current and new bicycle facilities, safe driver and bicyclist behavior, and events related to walking and biking.

» Ensure that high speed and/or high volume roads do not pose a barrier to bicycling in your community. Road and/or lane diets may be appropriate for calming traffic while providing safe and comfortable places for people to bike and walk.

» The "Cycle Safe" program of the Venice Police Department is a great effort to build upon in order to address traffic safety. Ensure that the data from this program is used to guide investments that improve interactions between people who bike and people who drive.
