Subject: Traffic situations

Hi Linda,

I have suggestions to improve two traffic scenarios.

1. Intersection at West Venice Ave and Ave Des Parques. Specifically the section between the east and west bound lanes of West Venice There is little traffic at this intersection. I suggest the "Through" lane on Ave Des Parques (right lane) be eliminated and combined with the "Left" turn lane (left lane). Cars in the current right lane must make an immediate left and right turn in order to avoid cars parked on Ave Des Parques south of the intersection. The added benefit of this is that this will create room for approximately 6 diagonal parking spots where the "Through" lane used to be.

2. Intersection of Harbor Drive and West Venice Ave, South bound lanes on Harbor. I suggest that the right lane be restricted to "Right" turn only, not "Right" and "Through". The reason for this is that there is little room for through traffic to merge on the south bound section once cars have crossed the intersection.

I'll gladly meet you at these spots, so you have a better visual idea of the proposed changes.
