2. (Mining, Page 7) Change Intent OS1.7 Mining Considerations to...the city shall minimize potential negative activities/impacts from mining operations. Negative impacts shall include but not be limited to negative impacts on public health, welfare, and safety and environmental preservation.

3. (Under Mining Considerations p. 7) Under Mining Considerations include strategies that define public health, welfare, and safety which include but are not limited to public health standards in regards to noise, illumination, dust, air and ground pollution, and truck/heavy construction traffic and environmental standards in regards to the prohibiting of extreme well stimulation and injection wells and wastewater sludge/pits.

4. All/mining operations must present detailed plans on environmental impacts, mitigation and clean up procedures, and obtain insurance policies necessary to cover all costs prior to obtaining permits.

5. All/mining operations shall be monitored by the city and financed by the mining company to ensure no negative impacts on citizen health, welfare, or safety or on the environment occur.

6. Under Mining Strategy OS1.7.2.page 8; Reclamation Plan include that the Reclamation Plans are funded entirely by the mining company and secured by an insurance plan to cover all costs.
