

# AMERICAN IMPORT AUTO FLEET DIVISION

At the request of the Finance Dept., we evaluated the following vehicles:

Unit # 167: The 2004 Ford F-150 Pickup Truck has a knock in the lower end of the engine indicating major engine repairs needed. The cost of repairs would be greater than the value of the vehicle, which is why we recommend replacing this vehicle at this time.

Unit #243: The 2003 Ford F150 Pickup Truck, the vehicle has over 110,000 miles and has been burning over 3 quarts of oil between oil changes, which is caused by the engine internally breaking down. The cost of repairs would be greater than the value of the vehicle, which is why we recommend replacing this vehicle at this time.

Unit # 221: The 1973 Caterpillar Grader, the vehicle is over 40 years old and needs repairs to the fuel and hydraulic systems on the unit. The City has other tractors which are more suitable for the tasks this vehicle was used for. Taking this into consideration we recommend the vehicle be surplus of at this time.

Unit # 251: 2003 Ford F-250 Truck, the body and bed are severely rusted and needs major metal and body work due to the rust. The automatic transmission is slipping which indicates internal failure. Taking this into consideration along with the age, mileage, hours and overall condition of this vehicle, we recommend replacement at this time.

Unit # 260: 2004 Ford F450 Super Duty Truck, this vehicle has oil consumption and engine cooling system concerns that will require costly repairs in the near future. The rear body and crane are also a concern and need to be addressed. The cost of repairs would be greater than the value of the vehicle, which is why we recommend replacing this vehicle at this time.

Unit # 311: 2004 Ford F350 Super Duty 1 Ton — Pickup, this vehicle has transmission and engine cooling system concerns that will require costly repairs in the near future. The under carriage is deteriorating and needs to be repaired. The cost of repairs would be greater than the value of the vehicle, which is why we recommend replacing this vehicle at this time.

These vehicles are parked out at the Eastside water plant if you would like to personally inspect them.
