Thank you, Councilman Daniels, for following through with this. Sarasota County adopted their project priorities on March 21, 2017. Pinebrook Road and East Venice Avenue has now been on the County's adopted project priorities list for two years and is currently ranked as #10 of 18 total projects within the county boundaries. The three phases of River Road are projects #1, #2, and #3. Project #4 is the extension of the Legacy Trail. Project #14 is Sidewalks on Jacaranda Blvd from Border Rd to Commercial Ct/Executive Dr.
