## PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES 2017 -2018

- <u>Lime pit removal</u>; removal of 50,000 cubic yards of lime from two pits located in Pinebrook Park; funded by the Utilities Department
- Archives Building: Purchase of property at 224 Milan Avenue, to be converted into an archives and museum research center. Funds provided by a private donor for the purchase and renovation
- <u>Utilities Water Lines</u> Completion of four phases of a a citywide water line relocation project; moving water lines from the rear of privately owned properties to the city RW in front of the property
- <u>Automated trash collection:</u> The Solid Waste & Recycling division successfully introduced automated trash pick-up with an initial pilot project. The program is in its second phase with phase three planned for the near future
- <u>Fire Department vehicle:</u> The Fire Department took delivery on a new apparatus for Station #1; acquired for \$535,000 and funded from the one-cent sales tax
- Bond Validation: After receiving voter approval for two major projects (construction of a new public safety facility for \$16 million, and reconstruction of 79 lane-miles of public roads for \$18 million, following the threat of a legal challenge to the voter referendum, the City elected to go through a bond validation process, that was successful
