

The new 195,048 SF facility was constructed on 23.41 acres. Construction consisted of exterior concrete tilt-wall construction with structural steel frame and low-slope roofs. The facility is capable of withstanding a Category 5 storm event with emergency generator power to accommodate critical building systems for continuous operations.

The facility includes a 72,917 gross SF (approx.) distribution center which is used for receiving, storing and shipping medical supplies and contains automated machinery, including but not limited to, carousels, picking and conveying systems.

A 51,404 SF cook/chill department enables food preparation and includes commercial grade kitchen equipment and a staff cafeteria.

A sterile processing department encompassing 44,056 SF contains hospital sterilization equipment used for instrument washing, sterilization, reassembly and repacking, including a pharmacy repackaging area for placing large quantities of pharmaceuticals into unit doses.

The 29,917 SF of administrative space contains executive offices, mid-level offices, conference rooms and open work areas.

Site Development on the 23.41 acres include site paving, parking, sidewalks, landscaping, irrigation system, site lighting, surface storm water management system, site monument design, site signage, trash dumpster enclosures, work to remedy poor soil conditions, the presence of ground water, and hazardous materials removal.

Rejection of Proposals

The City of Venice reserves the right to waive minor proposal irregularities, and to reject any and all Proposals or parts thereof, or to accept the Proposal(s) or parts thereof, when considered by it to be in the best interest of the City.
