## Proclamation

Whereas, the city supports breastfeeding friendly businesses and employers that provide workplace lactation support since it results in an impressive return on investment, including lower health care costs, absenteeism, turnover rates, improved moral, job satisfaction, and productivity; and

Whereas, the Healthy Start Coalition and the Breastfeeding Advocates of Sarasota County and its partners support the continued research and education in promoting breastfeeding as a high priority to improve the overall health of our community.
