Ms. Gates left the dais at 1:51 p.m.

Ms. Senne responded to council questions regarding renewal of the one-cent sales tax.

Ms. Gates returned to the dais at 1:53 p.m.

Ms. Senne spoke to miscellaneous revenue.

Discussion continued regarding Sharky's Restaurant and Jetty Jack's revenue share.

Ms. Senne reviewed the estimated general fund balance and reserves ending September 30, 2018, and responded to council questions regarding Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) reimbursement.

Ms. Senne spoke on general fund expenses and responded to council questions regarding the fire department's budget.

Ms. Senne spoke on the one-cent sales tax fund and responded to council questions regarding parks and recreation and discretionary sales surtax.

Ms. Senne reviewed expenses and projected fund balance for the one-cent sales tax, building permit fees, and police and fire impact fee funds.

Discussion followed regarding using impact fees for increased capacity, control and collection of police and fire impact fees, building permit fees fund, and building department staffing.

Ms. Senne spoke on the utilities and solid waste funds, and responded to council questions regarding solid waste and recycling rate increase.

Mr. Welch spoke on the solid waste and recycling fund.

Discussion continued regarding reconvening the solid waste stakeholders group, reviewing all income possibilities, and reserves.

Ms. Senne reviewed the stormwater fund and proposed fiscal year (FY)

2019 budget changes, and responded to council questions regarding the Cultural Campus lighting.

Discussion ensued on the Cultural Campus lights.

Ms. Senne continued to review proposed changes to the FY19 budget.

Discussion took place regarding West Coast Inland Navigation Disctrict (WCIND) funding.

Recess was taken from 2:50 p.m. until 3:00 p.m.

<u>18-3463</u> Development Services Director, Jeff Shrum: Development Services Update (30 minutes)

Mr. Shrum provided an update on county zoned properties and recommendations on how to proceed.

Discussion took place regarding the city's zoning requirement on city property, annexations, Sawgrass neighborhood zoning, and land development regulations (LDR).

Mr. Shrum spoke to notifying property owners on seeking city rezoning and establishing a completion timeframe, LDR update overview to include new outline and existing layout, changes currently in process, and responded to council questions regarding the permit application process, building permit turnaround time, council's input on LDR draft, and LDR timeline.

Mr. Shrum spoke to mixed use districts and using form based codes.

Discussion followed on notifying residents on changes to the LDRs.

Mr. Shrum spoke regarding design and development standards.

Discussion followed on considering type of trees removed, Florida Yards landscaping, and meeting end time.

A motion was made by Vice Mayor Daniels, seconded by Council Member Cautero, to end the meeting at 5:00 p.m. and continue items to September 11, 2018 council meeting. The motion carried 5-2 with Mayor Holic and Mr. Newsom opposed.

Mr. Shrum clarified September 30, 2019 is the contract completion date.

Discussion ensued on conducting neighborhood meetings during season.

Mr. Shrum reviewed the building division's July 2018 activity report for permits issued, plans reviewed, and technical inspections, and responded to council questions regarding educating contractors on required permits.

Mr. Shrum spoke on TrackIT software implementation, building department staffing, and code enforcement to include host compliance software, summary of activities, and staffing.
