Based upon the material provided by the applicant and the City of Venice's Architectural Guidelines Handbook, Historical Resources provides the following comments:

- 1. (D) Doors and Windows, (1) Area, Treatment: Treatment: At least fifty percent of the all doors and windows shall have at least one of the following elements:
  - a. Frames recessed a minimum of 4 inches.
  - b. Columns, pilasters, rusticated blocks, precast or stucco decorative trim.
  - c. Cornices, spandrels or otherwise articulated lintels.
  - d. Semi-circular or triangular pediments.

From the materials provided it is not clear that the windows meet this requirement.
