## Auburn Woods Action Committee, (AWAC) AWAC Committee Recommendation Report #20 11-20-18

## City Manager coming to the 11-26-18 AW Board Meeting

- A. The Venice City Manager, Ed Lavallee, and the Public Safety Facility Planning Committee, have made a proposal to the Auburn Woods Community, that a 6 ft. vinyl clad chain link fence (to meet hurricane standards) be installed on their property 22 ½ feet from our western property line, and to include a 20-foot-wide vegetative screening barrier to be provided by the City. To move the Public Safety Facility project along, the Building Committee requests AW confirmation of certain landscaping details for the completion of the Site and Development Plan. The details would include Protection and Fortification of the existing vegetative barrier, and the need to help thicken the vegetation on the south end of the property.
- B. With a vote of 6 to 2, <u>the AWAC Committee recommends that the</u> <u>Auburn Woods Board of Directors consider the City's proposal with</u> <u>certain reservations</u> regarding additional explanations of the fence type, and assurances of long-term maintenance. Our request is:
- That the vegetative screening be installed so that it will effectively screen off the fence from the Auburn Woods Residents view and that the City will maintain this screening vegetation and the fence for as long as the City's Public Safety Facility is operational by the City. And that Mr. Lavallee and the Planning Committee answer any additional questions as requested by the Auburn Woods Community Board of Directors.
- 2. That the City Council passes a resolution/motion that states the above statement #1. regarding the screening and maintenance of the property.
