Case No.Sharon K. Fraley, 1318 Karen Drive: Violation of the City of Venice CodeCEEN19-001of Ordinances Chapter 34, Environment, Article III, Nuisances, Division 2,08Offensive Accumulation, Sec. 34-81(a)(c), Prohibited ExceptionsMs. Fernandez called the case and questioned board members on
ex-parte communications and conflicts of interest. There were none.

Mr. Nixon, being duly sworn, presented the city's case to include site photographs and inspections, notice of recurring violation, contact with property owner, final inspection, affidavit of compliance, and requested board find the respondent was in violation but corrected the violation prior to the hearing, and if the same violation occurs within the next five years a repeat violation be issued and fines assessed from the date viewed.

No one signed up to speak.

Mr. Young closed the public hearing.

A motion was made by Mr. Reilly, seconded by Ms. Keeler, that based on the sworn testimony and evidence presented, the board finds respondent had a recurring violation of Section 34-81(a) and (c) of the City Code of Ordinances, but that the respondent corrected the violation prior to the hearing. Respondent is put on notice that future violations of Section 34-81(a) and (c) will cause the respondent to be deemed a repeat violator and subject to a fine of up to \$500.00 per day for each new violation beginning on the day the violation occured.
