SUBJECT: Approve Ordinance No. 2019-30 to update the Solid Waste Code

Background: At the June 11, 2019 City Council meeting, the Solid Waste & Recycling Stakeholder's Group presented a series of recommended updates to the Solid Waste Ordinance to improve collection efficiency, increase revenue and protect the environment. This ordinance revision is intended to implement these recommendations. There will be an additional update of this ordinance in several months, to implement the single stream recycling policy and regulations.

Below is a summary of the revisions which are included in this ordinance update:

- 1) Addition of \$100.00 cart fee for new solid waste customers or for replacement carts.
- 2) Removal of the 65 gallon size option for commercial can service.
- 3) Removal of plastic bags for disposal of yard waste. Customers must use garbage cans, paper bags, or bundles for curb-side yard waste disposal.
- 4) Solid Waste rate increase for Can Service and Roll-Off Containers of 4% as scheduled for FY20.
- 5) Roll-Off delivery and relocation fee, and dumpster lock-bar fee of \$100.00.
- 6) Private Roll-Off Container Hauler Permit Process: This section defines the permit process for private hauler companies that conduct roll-off dumpster service within the City limits. This section includes the application process, insurance requirements, proper methods of collection and permit enforcement. The monthly collection fee to the private hauler company will be defined within the permit agreement, and will be based on the cubic yardage of waste collected within the City, per month. This permit will be issued to the private hauler company for a period of three years and will be managed by the Public Works Department.
