During a recent personal interview, a homeless person said:

After many years of feeding the homeless population myself, in Oct. of 2015 I had lost everything. Car stolen, job lost, lost my home due to losing job due to losing my vehicle, I did not have a clue what I was going to do as a result of this ripple effect. I fortunately had my household items, so I made a camp. Luckily, I had a social service office only 3 miles away. I filed homeless status which gave me \$200 a month, that's great except how do you get nonfood items? I found ways, recycle, pray for someone to give you a day's worth of work. Keep in mind I grew up in this California mountain town, no one would hire me because I had no physical address, I found myself digging through dumpsters behind the grocery stores, thrift stores, and local businesses.

The last day, February 10, 2017, of my almost 2 year stretch I was across the street from my home (my camp) working for my local church. I went home and found EVERYTHING burnt down to my toothbrush. I was devastated beyond words. I wanted to end this all; it would be so much easier than going through this suffering. But I decided to go back across the highway. The pastor saw me black from soot trying to salvage anything I could. He right then and there bought me a train ticket sending me on my way to a safe place. I will never forget the kindness and love I felt that day; someone actually cared. I now have the passion to carry on and give others HOPE, getting them off the streets and showing them humanity does exist and there is HOPE around the corner. My name is Kim Martin and I've been there and I truly believe in H.O.P.E. Housing Our People Everywhere!

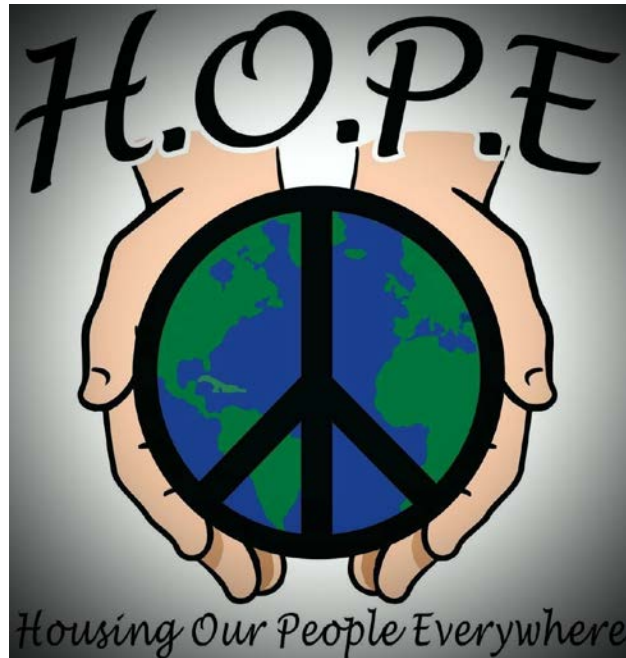
