SUBJECT: Approval of purchase from Schafer Systems, Inc. of automated Recycling and Garbage carts in the amount of \$592,618.43

#### Background:

Per the recommendations of the Solid Waste Stakeholder Group, and as previously approved by City Council on June 11, 2019, the Public Works Department is moving forward with the implementation of single stream, automated recycling collection and the final phase (Phase 4) of garbage automation. The roll-out of these automated carts is scheduled for January of 2020 and we have undertaken a city-wide public relations campaign to inform our residents of this exciting project. The purchase of these automated carts is the final step to automate garbage and recycling collection for the entire City of Venice. The Recycling Partnership will be reimbursing the City approximately \$169,785.00 of this purchase through the previously awarded Coastal Recycling Grant.

The proposed purchase is from the manufacturer Schafer Systems, Inc., which has supplied all previous automated cart phases within the City. Unit pricing for the automated carts is from the Sourcewell (formerly NJPA) Contract #041217-SFR.
