B. COUNCIL ACTION/DISCUSSION

20-4370 Rescind Action Taken August 27, 2019 Denying Ordinance No. 2019-19 (a/k/a Order No. 18-10RZ) on Final Reading, An Ordinance Amending the Official Zoning Atlas of the City of Venice, Florida, for Multiple Parcels Located East of I-75 Between Laurel Road and Border Road and Owned by Border Road Investments LLC; Myarra Property Joint Ventures LLC; Woolridge Investment-Florida LLC; and FC Laurel LLC; Pursuant to Rezone Petition No. 18-10RZ, from Commercial Mixed-Use (CMU) and Planned Unit Development (PUD) Districts to a Planned Unit Development (PUD) District; Providing for Repeal of all Ordinances in Conflict Herewith; Providing for Severability; and Providing for an Effective Date (Neunder)

A motion was made by Dr. Neunder, seconded by Dr. Fiedler, to approve Item No. 20-4370.

Mayor Feinsod ruled motion out of order.

Mayor Feinsod read an excerpt from Robert's Rules of Order.

Ms. Fernandez explained status of the Florida Land Use Environmental Dispute Resolution Act (FLUEDRA) proceeding to include staff is in the process of scheduling a mediation.

Discussion followed on the mayor's ruling.

Recess was taken at 9:43 a.m. until 9:51 a.m.

A motion was made by Vice Mayor Newsom, seconded by Dr. Fiedler, to appeal the mayor's decision of ruling the motion out of order.

Discussion followed on rescinding action taken August 27, 2019 and motion language.

Those in favor of sustaining the decision of the mayor:

Discussion continued regarding allowing fairness to new council members, mediation, rescheduling the public hearing, evidence supporting denial of the ordinance, the city's legal matters, setting a precedent of rescinding prior council decisions, FLUEDRA action, second reading of the ordinance, and new council members reviewing the July 9, 2019 and August 27, 2019 council meetings.

Ms. Fernandez noted council is not required to take public comment at today's hearing.

The motion to approve Item No. 20-4370 carried by the following vote:

Discussion ensued on having a full presentation by staff and the applicant at second reading.

A motion was made by Dr. Fiedler, seconded by Council Member Pachota, to direct staff to schedule Ordinance No. 2019-19 for final reading and provide public hearing notice pursuant to section 86-47 of the Code of Ordinances, and have full presentations by all parties. The motion carried by the following vote:

- <u>20-4371</u> Discuss Venice Code of Ethics Revisions (Fernandez)

Ms. Fernandez spoke regarding the city's and state's code of ethics, enforcement process, code adoption and applicability, refining the city's code to ensure protections and compliance with state law, and responded to council questions on the number of ethic complaints filed to include elected officials versus employee complaints.

Discussion followed regarding complaints during council elections, code violations, revising code language, difference between the city's and state's code, staff time, other municipalities with their own code of ethics, adopting the state's code, and revising the city's code.

A motion was made by Council Member Pachota, seconded by Dr. Neunder, to direct the city attorney to draft an ordinance removing the city's code of ethics and adopting the state's code of ethics. The motion carried unanimously by voice vote.

C. PRESENTATIONS

20-4372 Robert J. Spong, Venice Lions Club: Venezia Park Universal Playground (10 Min.)

Mr. Clinch commented on the presentation's intent.

Robert Spong, Venice Lions Club, provided a presentation and spoke to current playground area, original John Nolen plan, universally accessible

playgrounds, 2017 comprehensive plan, parks system master plan, the park's rating from the master plan, Garden of the Five Senses playground in North Port, concept plan, project cost estimates and funding, return on investment and involvement, and partnering with public works for the playground.

Discussion followed regarding the need for a playground, inclusive playgrounds, including playground equipment that adapts to disabled young adults, long term maintenance fees, maintenance of equipment and rubberized surface, durability of rubberized surface and cost of replacement, surface water drainage, handicap parking, other areas in the city with rubberized mats, and park plans.

Jeffery Boone, city resident, commented on the Venice Lions Club, moving playground project forward, rubberized surfaces, and social media.

Ms. Fernandez inquired if council wants to add language in the code that addresses split votes.
