Hi Jeff,  
I was a bit confused at a previous workshop. I was under the impression that demolition orders, certificates of architectural compliance etc only pertained to those properties that agreed to be on the registry. Would it be possible at the next LDR workshop after May 12 to clarify where these orders etc. apply. For example demolition order, the definition of the demolition order and then who it would apply to. I know there are more items than just the national or local registry of historic places, certificates of architectural compliance, demolition orders so if you could outline everything that pertains to the properties that would be very helpful.

I also have some information on the hurricane protection devices. This comes from the Florida fire prevention code 7th edition. 7.5.2.3 hurricane protection devices pretty clearly defines when you can put up hurricane shutters. The life safety code 7.2.1.5.3 defines how the hurricane protection should be operated. Let me know if I have to provide the documentation for this discussion or if you can provide that.
