<u>23-6111</u> Presentation by John Holic on Roberts Bay Artificial Reef project.

John Holic and Linda Short from Venice Yacht Club, presented Robert's Bay Revitalization Initiatives, goals of the program, partnerships in the community, measuring water quality, obtaining global permit, number of docks in Robert's Bay, funding, similar projects, Coastal Heartland National Estuary Partnership (CHNEP), vertical oyster gardens, size of reefs, installation details, loss of natural filtration from mangroves and oyster beds, vendor used, annual maintenance checks, artificial reef information, disposal process, deployment in southwest Florida, photo of mini reef, changing from stainless steel strapping to polypropylene, history of managing red tide blooms, looking for docks for placement, and answered board questions on permits, CHNEP, marketing of measured results, density of garden or reef, space needed, grant received, polypropylene being safe for water, effectiveness over time, vendor selection, Hurricane lan damages, fundraising goals, working with dock restoration companies, and potential Midnight Pass impact.
