#### Public Works

<u>19-4143</u> Approval of Unit Price Term Contracts for Disaster Debris Removal, Reduction, Disposal and Other Emergency Cleanup Services with Crowder Gulf Joint Venture, Inc., DRC Emergency Services, LLC, and Southern Disaster Recovery Services, LLC

A motion was made by Council Member Daniels, seconded by Council Member Fiedler, to approve Item No. 19-4143.

Discussion took place on requiring contractors to remove and cleanup all disaster debris.

Mr. Clinch noted the contract language is tailored to meet Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) requirements and contractors will pick up items that are reimbursable.

The motion carried by voice vote 6-1 with Mr. Daniels opposed.

<u>CON. NO.</u> Approval of Term Contract for Five Years, Between the City of Venice and <u>151-2019</u> Single Stream Recyclers, LLC, for Single Stream Recycling Processing in the Amount not to Exceed \$600,000 Annually

A motion was made by Council Member Daniels, seconded by Council Member Fiedler, to approve CON. NO. 151-2019.

Discussion took place on customers closing dumpster lids, pickup of wet recycling items, moisture contamination, public education, delivery of automated cans in January 2020, grant, contract not to exceed amount, projected costs, recycling volume and rate surcharge, contract price, vendor, selling the city's recyclable materials, single streaming, and reducing environmental impact by excluding disposal of plastic bags.

The motion carried unanimously by voice vote.

<u>19-4138</u> Alan Bullock, Director of Human Resources; Ray Carter, Gehring Group Risk Management Consultant and Clay Austin, FMIT Director of Trust Services: Request to Approve Renewal of Property and Liability Insurance from October 1, 2019 to September 30, 2020

Mr. Bullock spoke to the city's property and liability insurance coverage for fiscal year 2020, the city's risk exposure, Florida Municipal Insurance Trust (FMIT) and Preferred Governmental Insurance Trust (PGIT) options, workers' compensation claims, and recommended council select FMIT.

Ray Carter, Gehring Group Risk Management Consultant, noted conducting site visits and identifying areas to lower the city's risk exposure, and spoke regarding special events, identifying proper insurance for special events, hurricane expenses, FMIT, and workers' compensation retention.

Clay Austin, FMIT Director of Trust Services, commented on risk management and the city's partnership.

Mr. Carter responded to council questions regarding future addition of Emergency Medical Services (EMS), legislative impacts, and recommended to increase the funding level five percent.

Discussion followed on special events risk and liability, insurance guarding against crime/employee dishonesty, insurance coverage for volunteers, FMIT proposal, workers' compensation claims, claims within the last five years, adopt-a-park program, flood insurance, and insurance premiums on new hardened buildings.

A motion was made by Council Member Daniels, seconded by Council Member Moore, to approve Item No. 19-4138 as presented by staff with the selection of Florida Municipal Insurance Trust (FMIT). The motion carried unanimously by voice vote.

Recess was taken at 10:15 a.m. until 10:25 a.m.

## D. COUNCIL ACTION/DISCUSSION

<u>19-4140</u> Request to Abort the Pinebrook/Venice/Ridgewood Avenues Intersection Capital Improvement Project and Request Sarasota County to Redirect the Funds to Expand Laurel Road (Fiedler)

A motion was made by Council Member Fiedler, seconded by Council Member Gates, to approve Item No. 19-4140.

Ms. Fiedler spoke to funding Laurel Road's expansion and requested to reduce funding allocation for the Pinebrook/Venice/Ridgewood Avenues intersection improvement project and redirect remainder of funds to Laurel Road's expansion.

Ms. Fiedler withdrew her motion and Ms. Gates withdrew her second to the motion.

A motion was made by Council Member Fiedler, seconded by Council Member Gates, to reduce funding allocation to \$2.3 million for the Pinebrook/Venice/Ridgewood Avenues intersection improvement project and redirect remainder of funds to Laurel Road's expansion.

Discussion took place on staff providing a presentation to council, obtaining documentation from the county on their funding commitment, the city's commitment on improving the Pinebrook Road and East Venice Avenue intersection, ability to fund both projects, transportation study, staff's perspective on priorities and timeline, considering a public/private partnership, previous council action on the Jacaranda Road extension, engaging the county, Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) and Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), the county's transportation plan, comprehensive plan, accidents at the Pinebrook Road and East Venice Avenue intersection, public safety, adding Laurel Road's expansion to the capital improvement project list, and unintended consequences.

Vice Mayor Cautero requested staff's perspective on available funding, Pinebrook/Venice/Ridgewood Avenues intersection project estimate, using impact fees for other projects, alternate funding sources that can be utilized, and public/private partnerships.

Discussion continued regarding the transportation study, the city's relationship with the county, obtaining documentation on the county's funding commitment, including the city engineer's input to staff's presentation, and ability to readdress a failed motion.

The motion failed by voice vote 1-6 with Ms. Fiedler in favor.
